Winter air has less water in it than summer air and the humidity in a stored instrument case may become dangerously low. Humidifiers can be used but must be checked regularly to ensure that they are appropriately moist and keeping our stored instruments safe. Enjoy the new year and the winter activities that have arrived and remember that winter safety should include the safety of your instruments both the ones you take with you and the ones that you leave at home.
